How it works:

- The Office of Attorney General partners with District Attorneys and local police departments to help you open your doors to people seeking addiction treatment.
- When people come in for help, this program promises no threat of arrest or prosecution for minor drug offenses. Therefore, this is not a "diversion" program in the traditional sense.
- After conducting a brief intake, law enforcement personnel will help connect them immediately to a local treatment facility.

How does the Office of Attorney General help?

- We will help establish connections and partnerships with local treatment facilities.
- You will have access to our bank of sample documents and policies to help you get the program up and running quickly.
- We will assist with promoting the program in your community to ensure that those who need it will know that it is there

What would your department need to do?

- Maintain relationships with local treatment facilities once they are established (and, if possible, seek out and develop new relationships with other treatment providers).
- Conduct intake and facilitate treatment referrals.
- Help track statistics so that the Office of Attorney General can evaluate and improve the program.
